

With 71 concerts at Owen Park (well, most of them anyway) and the first season (7 shows) of TNB Unplugged, we are sure the blues are alive and well in western Wisconsin. We still believe the format of one band per night gives both the performers and crowd a better opportunity to enjoy Tuesday Night Blues. We not only welcome any suggestions on what we can do to improve Tuesday Night Blues, but want to encourage you to please go to ChippewaValleyBlues.com and let us hear what you think on the comment page. We love to hear from you at the Tuesday Night Blues at Owen Park Facebook page (remember to "like" the page) also. Let us know who you definitely want back on the schedule.

Be sure to check out the website's "Blues On The Horizon" event calendar to aet updates on where vour favorite bands are playing, and let them know you saw it on our website. Encourage your favorites to let us know where they are playing so we can keep it updated.

Your generosity in giving has once again helped us to overcome a lack of sponsorships so we can continue bringing Tuesday Night Blues to you. To give you an idea where the money goes, we pay the talent almost on a par with the local bars (actually more than some), both musicians and production. In addition to the application and facility rental fees to the City Parks and Rec. Department, we provide insurance for all of these events. The Bluesletter is printed weekly (you probably noticed that), regardless if you keep one or not. (They are all posted on line at the website as well, "Tuesday Night Blues Past"), and the websites are among a myriad of smaller expenses, including the Bluesmobile when it was still available.

Almost all the folks you see working here at the tent, passing out Bluesletters, picking trash up after the shows, and setting up and tearing down the tent, are folks, like you, who work at least one full-time job and volunteer their time to make this happen. They all appreciate the thanks you have expressed for their efforts. That said, we can really use more volunteers for many of these small jobs, and need some who would enjoy the feeling of accomplisment that comes from being involved in the planning, organization, scheduling and marketing of Tuesday Night Blues. Some with fund-raising and grant writing skills would be so appreciated. After five years our core group has changed only slightly, but we have experienced some attrition, understandably. So, if you have a little, or a little more, time to contribute, we really need your help.

The TNB fan base is growing all the time and the support and response has been great. It feels pretty special to have the bands saving what an awesome event we have and thanks so much for including them. Every performer has expressed this to us! It really makes all the effort worth while.

In addition, the Chippewa Valley Blues Society gave a \$500.00 matching donation to Blues On The Chippewa this year. We have been supporting this very special event since it's inception. I don't have official numbers, but BOTC raised more than \$4000.00, most going to the Pepin County (continued on next page)
